



Foliage Forecaster

Typical change from mid-September until the end of October.

Remember that the foliage might change based on summer weather or heavy rain during fall.

Watch the colors change!

The Forecaster shows where and when the colors typically change in Vermont during a normal foliage season.



Instructions:
You can start and stop the animation at any time. Additionally, you can click on the date to advance the animation manually.


Please note: This is only an approximation of typical foliage color progression. The exact timing of the color change varies year to year. Please refer to our official foliage reports for the latest foliage information.

Leaves change color based on a variety of factors including light level, temperature, soil conditions and more. Here in Vermont, the color starts in northern regions and at higher elevations, progressing southward and downward into the valleys.
